



Development Navigation


Support to streamline the development process:

• The Colorado Enterprise Zone (EZ) program is a program that encourages job creation and capital investment in targeted areas

• Inclusion in the zone allows businesses and (in some instances) property owners to claim annual state income tax credits for such things as capital investments, hiring employees, research and development expenditures, and more

Lakewood offers competitive incentives evaluated on a case-by-case basis, focusing on:

- **Job Creation**: Encouraging employment opportunities within the community.
- Capital Investment: Promoting investments in infrastructure and business development.
- Public Benefit: Ensuring projects provide clear advantages to the public.
- Removal of Blight: Supporting efforts to eliminate urban decay.
- **Community Investment**: Fostering initiatives that benefit the local community.

County Level

- **Personal Property Tax Rebate**: Jefferson County may rebate up to 50% of corporate personal property taxes for four years for qualifying companies.






Average Commute


